Abstract:

XML is destined to be the language of the Internet and consequently has attracted a lot of attention from every sector of the I.T. industry. The flexibility of XML brings along new technology management and engineering issues that need to be addressed. Such issues are concerns of companies of all sizes and appropriate development tools are highly desirable. This talk covers the concerns of enterprises in their adoption of XML and the technical solutions provided by ezXML which has been developed for over two years by SYSTEK. In particular, increasing the programming productivity through various gateways and code generation mechanisms will be explained.

About the speaker:

Dr. Chan has held various industrial, academic, and research positions in different countries since 1985. His service in Hong Kong includes an appointment with the New World Hotel Group and the Digital Equipment Corporation (DEC). His international appointments include university and research positions in the U.K., the Netherlands, Israel, and France. Currently, he is an Executive Director and the Chief Technology Officer of SYSTEK Information Technology Limited, which is listed in the GEM board in Hong Kong. His responsibility includes strategic planning on technology as well as the research and development effort of the company. He also serves on the Advisory Committee of the World Wide Web Consortium (W3C), an international organization governing the development of Internet related international standards and technologies. Recently, he has been awarded the Ten Outstanding Young Digi Persons award by the Hong Kong Productivity Council, Hong Kong Junior Chamber, and Government's Information Technology Services Department.
